Burlington Telehandler Certification - A telehandler certification program could be taken by potential operators who have previous experience with driving standard forklifts and for those with no previous experiences on a lift truck. The real-world training provided by these courses produces graduates well versed in the safe and correct use of these types of machines.

Telehandler certification courses could be finished at a third party location or at the work site of the trainees. To be able to acquire the formal training at a specific training facility, the manufacturer may work out a licensing agreement to be able to bring other individuals to a training facility. This option offers trainees with the chance to learn to make use of the machinery in a controlled setting. Upon completion, participants receive a certification or license to use this type of machinery.

When the training is carried out on the worksite, a skilled instructor is sent to the work location. This is the best way to make certain that your employees receive particular training on the equipment that they will be working with, helping to train the trainee in their own work environment. Trainees learn about potentially dangerous cases which could arise on the actual work site. The instruction focuses on whatever circumstances which are specific to the work location, enabling operators to be ready to safely handle these elements.

"Telehandler" is an abbreviated version of the term "telescopic handler," which references the machines extending or telescoping arm supporting a fork. The characteristics and controls of the telehandler are somewhat similar to a forklift. A telehandler has the capability of transporting and lifting loads up and away from the vehicle. Improper use of telehandlers could result in serious accidents. If load limits are exceeded, the machine can tip due to excess weight on the lift. It is the responsibility of the operator to understand load limitations and to safely make use of these machines.

"Conversion" classes are designed for operators who have been certified to utilize a forklift. These conversion classes will teach the differences between the operation of a forklift and a telehandler, all the while trying to avoid repetitive information that the forklift operator is already familiar with. For trainees who have no past experience using telehandler machinery, training covers the basic operation and utilization of the equipment. Some groups offer refresher courses too.
